Resolved, That the Bar of Cook county tender to the surviving relatives of the deceased, their sincere condolence with this afflicting dispensation of Providence, and as a testimonial of respect for his memory will proceed in a body to his funeral, and wear the usual bage of mourning.

Resolved, That the Cook county Count be requested, on motion, to enter the foregoing resolutions of record.

On motion of Mr. Arnold, Mr. S. Lisle Smith was appointed to present the above resolutions to the

Court on Thursday morning next, and request that they be entered of record. On motion, ordered that the Secretary forward a
